A good rule of thumb to keep in mind is that only about half of the people on a guest list will be able to make the trip to the wedding destination. This gives a general idea of what size of package they will need, but once again it's important to remain flexible. The best way to do that is by making sure to hire an experienced wedding agent who has seen it all and can help with any bumps that happen along the way.

Tymchen also recommends buying travel insurance. Doing so will protect a couple from natural disasters, illnesses, and other unforeseen circumstances that can't be planned for, including happy events such as a pregnancy. "Travel insurance gives peace of mind, no matter what happens," says Tymchen.

What are this year's destination wedding hot spots? Tymchen says the Caribbean is always popular, with Jamaica as the happening spot in 2019. Not only is the scenery beautiful, but the safety and affordability of the island are making it the go-to place for couples. Additionally, since English is the primary language of Jamaica, it's easier to coordinate with local agents and complete the necessary legal documents.
